

## Martin Creed Work No. 1059, 2011 Scotsman Steps

**Martin Creed makes art 'to make people's lives better'. The Fruitmarket Gallery commissioned his marble staircase which links the North Bridge and Market Street as part of a refurbishment of the historic Scotsman Steps, taking art out of the Gallery and putting it literally under people's feet.**

**Each step and landing is a different colour and type of marble, 104 in all, making the staircase a joy to walk up or down.**



# Exhibition **Jim Lambie** 27 June – 19 October 2014



**Scottish artist Jim Lambie is known for visually compelling, generous and beguiling work that attracts both popular and critical acclaim. His work makes its magic from relatively humble materials – tinfoil and coat hangers, jackets, mirrors, records, turntables, potato sacks, plastic bags and household paint.**

Lambie first came to public prominence in the late 1990s, and this exhibition includes some of his earliest sculptures, reassessing them in the light of more recent work. *Zobop* (1999), the multi-coloured floor piece that is the artist's best-known work, is joined both by early works such as *The Kid with the Replaceable Head* (1996) and a new enlarged version of *Shaved Ice* (2012/14) that turns the ground floor of the Gallery into a spectacular hall of mirrors, offering the opportunity to trace the development of Lambie's exuberantly

intelligent and visually arresting sculptural language. Bringing together two decades of sculpture, the exhibition is part of Edinburgh Art Festival 2014 and GENERATION, a Scotland-wide celebration of the last 25 years of contemporary art.

## Coming up: **Stan Douglas** 7 November – 15 February 2015

**Coming next is a solo exhibition of the work of Stan Douglas, a Canadian artist who came to prominence in the mid-1990s when his film installation *Der Sandmann* was one of the highlights of Documenta X in 1997, and who has been at the forefront of the international art scene ever since.**

We are excited to be bringing *Der Sandmann* to Scotland, in an exhibition that includes film, video and photography. It explores Douglas' use of technologies, narratives, and realities both virtual and actual to examine the intersection of history and memory in evocative, mesmerising artworks. The most recent works in the exhibition foreground Douglas' interest in the constructed nature of photographic 'reality'. *Corrupt Files* (2013) are material renderings of pure digital data that look like beautiful abstractions, while *Hogan's Alley* and *Hotel Vancouver* (2014) are computer generated renderings that look like incredibly detailed historical photographs.

*Hogan's Alley* and *Hotel Vancouver* were made as the 'set' for *Helen Lawrence*, an artwork in the form of a piece of theatre that is one of Stan Douglas' most ambitious works so far. *Helen Lawrence* will be presented as part of the Edinburgh International Festival this August.
